



## Poster Presenter Guidelines

Thank you for being a part of the Sixth International Conference on Traffic and Transport Psychology. The Conference Organising Committee looks forward to welcoming you to the conference, and in ensuring that your presentation runs smoothly.

This guide is designed to help you prepare for your conference presentation, and includes some hints and tips for a successful presentation and conference experience.

### **Presenter Instructions**

Posters will be displayed electronically on designated computer screens during the four conference lunch breaks.

Each presenter has been allocated 5 minutes for their presentation.

The poster session chair will briefly introduce you at the beginning of your presentation. The chair will also provide guidance on your speaking time and show “1 min to go” and “time’s up” signs as your presentation time counts down.

**IMPORTANT:** Please send through your electronic poster prior to the event, via email to [icttp2016@gut.edu.au](mailto:icttp2016@gut.edu.au) by 16 July 2016. Please also bring your poster on a USB flash drive or have a backup of the file available in a web-accessible (e.g., email or Dropbox) location.

### **Poster Template**

Poster dimensions: On-screen Show (16:9), Width: 25.4cm, Height: 14.29cm, Orientation: Landscape.

Authors are permitted to submit three slides per accepted poster, with one additional slide at the end for contact details (4 slides in total).

The page set up in the poster template is configured for the screens that will be used to display your poster. Do not change the template dimensions, otherwise you risk your poster not displaying correctly.
